10 CHARACTERISTICS OF SPIRITUAL GIFTS

- 1. Everyone has at least one spiritual gift.
- 2. No one has all of them, not even most of them.
- 3. Normally you will have one, maybe two, possibly even three that are primary. You will also have several others that are secondary.
- 4. Spiritual gifts first need to be discovered. Then they need to be developed, just like an athlete or musician needs to develop their talents.
- 5. Some spiritual gifts may be given at baptism and will follow you throughout your life (absolute gifts).
- 6. Other spiritual gifts are given because of a need at a particular time and that may last only as long as the need exists (relative or circumstantial gifts).
- 7. Gifts may be sought after, but require a need in the community of faith (desired gifts).
- 8. Spiritual gifts are not really gifts. They are more like endowments or loans.
- 9. Gifts are given not to the individual, but to the church *through* the individual. They are resources given by God to the people of God in order to accomplish what God wants accomplished in the world.
- 10. Spiritual Gifts are as natural as breathing to the one who possesses them. But they might appear awesome to others.

USES OF SPIRITUAL GIFTS

- 1. For mutual support (Romans 12.3; 1 Corinthians 12.25)
- 2. For the common good (1 Corinthians 12.7)
- 3. For the building up of the body of Christ (Ephesians 4.12b)
- 4. For the work of ministry (Ephesians 4.12a) [Reconciliation; healing; truth; love; justice; relationship with God and with neighbors]
