History of Diaconate in AZ Timeline



1980s

- With approval of 1979 Book of Common Prayer, defines role of Deacon.
- Order of Vocational Diaconate for the Diocese of Arizona evolves.
- Deacons ordained at varying times, informal formation.



1990s

- At direction of Bishop Shahan, deacon formation process begins in community as a cohort.
- In 1998, the formation program modified by Rebecca McClain+ and Veronica Ritson; consistent & structured process introduced focus on intertwining elements

2000s

- In 2003, Canon law changes separated Diaconate & Priest ordination processes.
- Since the "Class of 2008" the formation process toward ordination begins annually

2010-2020s

- •"Class of 2012" experienced revised time-line due to Commission on Ministry's (COM) application process/cycle changed.
- 2014 Bishop Smith issues Pastoral Letter: The Diaconate in the Diocese of Arizona for the 21st Century.
- 2015 Bishop Smith & Deacons' Council re-structure role due to sabbatical by The Venerable Veronica Ritson; to now include an Archdeacon Role & a Director of Deacon Formation role.
- June 2016 The Venerable Sarah Getts appointed Archdeacon; The Rev. Dr Robin Hollis, Director of Deacon Formation.
- 2016 to current curriculum updated, more focus on deacon life-long learning, deacon community meets for community building by geographic areas, deacon community service projects begin, & *Best Skills* added to post-ordination curriculum.
- June 2022 curriculum updated, added Digital Ministry. The Venerable Amy Bryan appointed Archdeacon

The World

Academic: Saturday: Classroom, lecture, discussion,

required reading, etc. - per Canon requirement

The World: Journaling by mixing scripture with "world" news

and events - "Listening to the Word"

Selecting readings of personal interest with Exploring:

written reflection - "Inquiring Minds Want to Know"

Sunday: Practicum thru participating at home parish Liturgy:

Evolution to date:

Liturgy

- Classroom subjects include Servant Leadership, Scripture, Church History, etc.
- Retreats (2) are: Community Building & "Care of Self w/Companions"
- Internship in another parish now 6 months(Sept-Feb)changed from 2 to 4 months.
- Milestone measurements though subject-presentations and a final essay exam.
- · Post-Ordination continued formation with "Best Skills Program" & mentoring.
- Realigned Curriculum flow & map to Deacon Competencies



Overview AZ Diaconate:



Deacon Formation Curriculum*

*Formation Year is based on a June-to -June period with curriculum and activities subject to change as formation is continually evolving.

Retreats:

Year 1 - June: Community Building (Friday afternoon to Sunday afternoon)

Year 2 - July: Care of Self & Care of Others (Friday afternoon to Sunday afternoon)

Experiential:

Year 1 February thru August of Year 2 -Sunday Practicum - 3rd Sunday of each month (at St. John's, Glendale or at Trinity Cathedral)

Year 2 - September to Feb. - Internship (6 months at a different parish)

Year 2/3: August - Nov. "Deacons in the World" In Community with non-profit or CPE "Lite"

Reflection/Reading/Writing: *

- On-going Journaling and Personal Reflections
- "Take and Read" (readings to broaden your understanding) Begins monthly in April of Year 1.
- Papers and Presentations
- Final Exam Essay

- Transforming One's Voice (2 sessions)
- Community Support (with Priest-in-Charge & Partner)
- Church History (2 sessions)

- Digital Ministry overview (2 sessions)
- Pre-Ordination (1.5 days)
- Post-Ordination (2 sessions)
- Post-Ordination (Yr. 2) Best Skills 6-month Program

Formation continues after Ordination with a variety of offerings to support life-long learning- 2 yrs.+
